
DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE HYPERSENSITIVITY IN THE TOOTH WITH MIH?



What you need to know about hypersensitivity:

- It is an exaggerated sensitivity felt in the tooth, like a "quick and acute pain"

- Affected teeth can be very sensitive, even if there is no fracture or wear.
- Discomfort may occur when drinking, eating, brushing the teeth or even just talking, brought about by the air on cold days.
- Failure to give the teeth a good brushing favors caries development
- Can influence your child's well-being and dental visiting behaviors

TREATMENT

- The dentist can advise you about the treatments available for hypersensitive teeth caused by MIH.

- Your participation is very important in treating hypersensitivity, because most of the procedures are used at home, and not in the dental office.

- It is important to know that the outcome of the treatments can be different for each child, and that it is not uncommon to combine approaches.
